A letter from the Weld County 4-H Foundation Board

The board of directors of the Weld County 4-H Foundation has unanimously voted to support the effort to raise the funds necessary to finance an endowed 4-H position at the Weld County office of Colorado State University Extension.

In discussing the proposal, the board felt such a position is needed in order to reach more youth, both urban and rural, to allow them to “learn by doing” and teach the life skills not always available from other sources. While Weld has one of the larger 4-H programs in Colorado, only a small percentage of Weld’s total youth population are enrolled in the program. While that will be the main focus of the endowed agent, part of his or her duties will be to develop agriculture leaders of the future. Today’s populace, in general, has very little knowledge of where their food comes from and such leaders will be needed in the future.

The board hopes you will see such a need for our future generations and support this effort.
